WWBIC has been working for the last 38 years to assist micro-enterprise and small business in Wisconsin, as well as serving as the Veterans Business Outreach Center for Wisconsin, Illinois and Minnesota. (See page 11 for more details on our services for veterans)

2024 Highlights

In 2024, WWBIC served 4,603 unduplicated clients throughout the state of Wisconsin (in partnership with funders, stakeholders, and community partners). WWBIC also secured funding to open a regional office in Hayward to better serve our rural communities in northern Wisconsin with training, technical assistance, and access to capital.

WWBIC also established a new record in 2024 – surpassing \$1 million in Kiva (crowd-sourced) loans over the course of the year, supporting 145 Kiva borrowers. The year closed out with a brand refresh – providing a new look while maintaining the mission of hope and opportunity that WWBIC has become known for.

Financial Wellness Impact

WWBIC has been providing financial wellness support through training and coaching as well as **\$1.92 million in match savings assistance since 1999**. This support has resulted in the impact numbers shown at right.

Loan Financing Eligibility

If a potential borrower answers “yes” to the following statements, there is a good possibility they will qualify for a WWBIC loan.

- Do you have a written business plan?
- Does or will your business operate in the state of Wisconsin?
- Are you a start-up business owner with extensive experience in your industry?
- Do you own an established business with a successful track record, and you're ready to grow or expand?
- Do you have a good understanding of business operations practices (management, financing, human resources, marketing, etc.)?
- Do you have an explanation for any imperfections in your credit history such as low credit scores, collections or bankruptcies? (We invite all credit histories to apply!)

WWBIC is honored to be one of twelve Community Development Financial Institutions who have created the Veteran Loan Fund. Eligible veterans who receive capital from this fund benefit from free business coaching and loans with lower interest rates.



VETERAN LOAN FUND

KIVA LOANS

Kiva offers loans through an online crowd-funding platform, offering loans from \$1,000-\$15,000 at 0% interest and no fee.

Kiva is often the first step towards access to capital. Unlike traditional lending, Kiva's holistic social underwriting provides an opportunity to see beyond traditional lending requirements. Kiva does not require a minimum credit score, collateral, or a business plan. Kiva believes that successful businesses have rich community networks, are good at marketing their businesses, and are tech-savvy. Kiva loans provide an opportunity for businesses to establish business credit.

HOW A KIVA LOAN WORKS:

Step 1: Apply

Potential borrowers follow step-by-step application to create a profile that will be used in crowdfunding a loan. WWBIC provides support if needed.

Step 2: Review

Kiva Capital Access Managers review applications and provide borrowers assistance prior to Kiva review. Kiva handles underwriting, establishes loan size, loan term and private lenders required.

Step 3: Fundraise

For up to 45 days, individual lenders support borrower's loan for as little as \$25 through the Kiva platform.

Private: Borrowers are given 15 days to crowdfund within their personal network.

Public: Loan profiles are posted on Kiva website offering exposure to 2 million Kiva lenders worldwide.

Step 4: Repay

Fully funded loans are disbursed electronically through PayPal. Repayments begin one month after receiving the loan. As borrowers make monthly loan payments, individual lenders are repaid.

WWBIC supports Kiva in Wisconsin, and our Kiva Capital Access Managers provide the personal touch to help borrowers through the application/loan life cycle.

From 2014 to 2024, WWBIC assisted 784 Kiva clients in securing \$5.42 million in loans!

BUSINESS PLAN ASSISTANCE

WWBIC is known and respected in Wisconsin for its business planning support and assistance for our clients. Clients looking for someone to assist them in reviewing and refining their business plan are paired one on one with a business expert to review their plan, go over feedback, and determine the next steps.

SMALL BUSINESS CONSULTANTS

WWBIC loan clients are matched with regional Small Business Consultants (SBCs) who work with them for the life of the loan. One-on-one support via their WWBIC SBC provides a sounding board for the owners of startup and expanding businesses. In addition, SBCs leverage WWBIC's many volunteer mentors and coaches to provide expertise when needed. This often includes legal, accounting, finance, and marketing support.



WWBIC SUPPORT FOR VETERANS
